Dear partner,

We are making improvements to deliver a more streamlined, digital immigration system which will be quicker and more secure for the millions of people who pass through the UK border each year.

Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs) are being introduced worldwide for visitors to the UK who do not currently need a visa for short stays, or who do not already have a UK immigration status prior to travelling. Visitors can find out when they need an ETA to travel and can apply on GOV.UK

- The introduction of Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs) is in line with the approach many other countries have taken to border security and helps prevent the arrival of those who present a threat to the UK.
- Eligible non-Europeans need an ETA to travel to the UK.
- Eligible Europeans can apply from 5 March 2025 and will need an ETA to travel from 2 April 2025.
- Applying for an ETA is quick and simple. Visitors should apply in advance and find out when to do so on GOV.UK
- An ETA currently costs £10 and permits multiple journeys to the UK for stays of up to six months at a time over two years or until the holder's passport expires – whichever is sooner.

Background

- Each year the UK welcomes millions of visitors from around the world. From holidays to short term study or business trips, the UK is a dynamic, diverse, and exciting destination.
- We are making improvements to deliver a more streamlined, digital immigration system which will be quicker and more secure for the millions of people who pass through the UK border each year.
- Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs) are being introduced worldwide for visitors to the UK who do not currently need a visa for short stays of up to six months, or who do not already have a UK immigration status.
- An ETA is a digital permission to travel it is not a visa and does not permit
 entry to the UK it authorises a person to travel to the UK.
- Eligible non-Europeans need an ETA to travel to the UK.
- Eligible European visitors can apply from 5 March 2025 and will need an ETA to travel from 2 April 2025.
- Applying for an ETA is quick and simple. Most applicants get an automatic decision in minutes when applying through the UK ETA app, which means spontaneous trips to the UK are still possible.
- Visitors are advised to allow three working days for a decision on their
 application, this is to take account of the small number of cases which may
 need further review. Visitors should apply in advance and find out when to do
 so on GOV.UK.
- An ETA currently costs £10 and permits multiple journeys to the UK for stays
 of up to six months at a time over two years or until the holder's passport
 expires whichever is sooner.
- The introduction of ETAs is in line with the approach many other countries have taken to border security, including the US and Australia, and helps prevent the arrival of those who present a threat to the UK.


Eligibility for an ETA

Eligible visitors, including children, who do not need a visa for short stays or
who do not have any other UK immigration status will need an ETA to travel to
the UK, including to transit through the UK (pass through the border).




